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Linda goes back to school!



A young mother has gone back to school, thanks to the support of a local employment project. After nine years away from the workplace, Linda Baker from Pembroke Dock has found a new job at a local school.

The mother of two was helped into her new role as a receptionist at Pembroke Dock Community School by the South West Workways Project- an EU backed employment project.

“It’s the first time I’ve worked in nine years and I absolutely love it,” she said.

“No day is ever the same. It’s also brilliant to be able to support my family.”

Linda began considering a return to work when her youngest child reached five. But despite submitting applications for numerous jobs, her childcare commitments, inability to drive and lack of recent work experience meant she was not even offered any interviews. So Linda signed up to Workways where she received tailored support.

“Workways helped me with my CV, they set me up on Universal Jobmatch and they put me on an interview techniques course,” she said.

When Linda mentioned she was volunteering at Pembroke Dock Community School as part of undertaking an NVQ in Business Administration, Workways secured her a paid temporary job as a receptionist at the school.

The role was ideal as the hours fitted around her children and she could also walk to work. And when the school got new funding, Linda was made a permanent member of staff.

“Workways is excellent, especially if you’re lacking confidence. They build you up, there’s always someone there to talk to and they help you adjust to just getting out there and meeting people.”

Milford Haven man lands dual job role with support from Workways

A Milford Haven man who was unemployed for over a year is back in work thanks to the support of an EU-backed employment project.

Now, 45 year old Manuel Barbosa is working as a labourer and taxi driver with Milford Haven based companies Smith Pembrokehire Group and Link Taxis after receiving a helping hand from South West Workways.

Having been laid off from a labouring job at Pembroke Refinery in December 2012, Manuel was having difficulty finding employment. In fact, all his speculative applications were met with silence.

"I didn't have the right qualifications to get a construction job - if you don't have a ticket, you can't get on site. It was a stressful time," said Manuel.

Having been referred to Workways by Jobcentre Plus, Manuel's search for employment took an upward turn.

In addition to completing a welding qualification off his own back, Manuel was helped by Workways to search for job vacancies and received funding to complete a Hackney Carriage Licence and purchase protective equipment. This led to him accessing temporary jobs as a labourer with Smith Pembrokehire Group and a driver with Link Taxis.

Manuel is delighted to have now been kept on permanently by both companies.

"It's good to finally have a job again - things are much easier with money," he said.

Manuel added "Workways are the best because they've given me everything I needed; everyone was really helpful."

4,000 people in South West Wales find job with help from EU-backed employment project

New figures show that over **4,000 people** in South West Wales have found jobs with the help of the South West Workways project.

This important milestone provides additional good news to a recent report by the Centre for Economic and Social Inclusion which found that “Workways is performing well against its key outcome targets, with high levels of satisfaction from participants and employers, and an excellent employment-outcome rate.”

Workways helps jobseekers overcome the barriers which prevent them from finding employment. The project is backed by the European Social Fund through the Welsh Government and is led by Neath Port Talbot Council in collaboration with Bridgend, Carmarthenshire, Pembrokeshire and Swansea Councils.

Participants receive help with job applications, CVs, interview techniques, personal development and access to training. Where appropriate, they also undertake paid temporary jobs with local employers to help them gain the experience needed to find long term employment. This is a particularly successful part of the project as **64% of participants** who undertake a temporary job move into permanent employment at the end of their contract.

Workways also provides recruitment support for local companies by advertising vacancies to its pool of job ready participants, shortlisting candidates, organising recruitment days and exploring business support avenues. Since 2009, the project has been in contact with **4905 businesses** across South West Wales.

Marjorie Bartlett, Workways Regional Project Manager, said “This is another important milestone for Workways. The achievement is a testament to the hard work of the Workways team and the jobseekers we have supported.”

Councillor Ali Thomas, Leader of Neath Port Talbot Council said “Congratulations to Workways and all the people across South West Wales who have found jobs with the support of the project. Workways provides invaluable support to jobseekers across South West Wales.”

Mae mam ifanc wedi dychwelyd i'r ysgol, o ganlyniad i'r cymorth y mae hi wedi'i gael gan brosiect cyflogaeth lleol. Ni fu Linda Baker, o Ddoc Penfro, yn y gweithle ers naw mlynedd ond bellach mae hi wedi sicrhau swydd newydd iddi ei hun mewn ysgol leol.

Mae hi'n fam l ddau blentyn a chafodd gymorth i sicrhau ei swydd newydd—derbynwraig yn Ysgol Doc Penfro—gan brosiect Gweithffyrdd y De-orllewin; prosiect cyflogaeth sy'n cael cymorth arian-nol gan yr UE.

“Dyma'r tro cyntaf i mi weithio ers naw mlynedd ac rwyf yn dwlu ar y swydd,” meddai.

“Mae pob diwrnod yn wahanol i'w gilydd ac maen'n wych hefyd, gan fy mod yn gallu cynorthwyo i gynnal fy nheulu.”

Fe ddechreuodd Linda ystyried dychwelyd i'r gwaith pan wnaeth ei phlentyn ieuengaf gyrraedd ei bump oed. “Fe roddodd Gweithffyrdd gymorth i mi gyda'm CV, trefnu Universal Jobmatch ar fy nghyfer a sicrhau fy mod yn cael mynd ar gwrs technegau cyfweiliad.” meddai.

Pan dywedodd Linda ei bod hi'n gwneud gwaith gwirfoddolyn Ysgol Gymunedol Doc Penfro fel rhan o'r cwrs NVQ mewn Gweinyddu Busnes yr oedd hi'n ei ddilyn, fe wnaeth Gweithffyrdd sicrhau swydd dros dro â chyflog iddi, fel derbynwraig yn yr ysgol. Roedd y swydd yn berffaith gan fod yr oriau 'n addas ar gyfer ei phlant a gallai hi hefyd gerdded i'r gwaith. A bellach ar ôl cael help llaw gan Gweithffyrdd y De-orllewin mae gan Manuel Barbosa, 45 oed, swydd ddeuol - labrwr a gyrrwr tacsï - mewn dau gwmni a leolir yn Aberdaugleddau, Smith Pembrokeshire Group a Link Taxis.



Roedd gydag e swydd labro ym Mhurfa Olew Penfro ond ym mis Rhagfyr 2012 cafodd ei ddiswyddo dros dro, ac ers hynny roedd e wedi cael anhawster cael swydd. Yn wir, ni chafodd ateb i unrhyw un o'i geisiadau ar hap.

"Nid oedd gyda fi'r cymwysterau iawn er mwyn cael swydd ym maes adeiladu - os nad oes cymhwyster 'da chi, chewch chi ddim mynd ar y safle. Roedd hi'n adeg boenus iawn imi," meddai Manuel.

Fe wnaeth y Ganolfan Byd Gwaith roi Manuel ar ben y ffordd a'i anfon at Gweithffyrdd, a dyna pryd y daeth tro ar fyd iddo yn ei ymdrech i gael swydd.
